SUBSTANCE-INDUCED PSYCHOSIS

This Clinical Day has been organized as part of Grace Hospital's continuing commitment towards incorporating the principles of Co-occurring Disorders Initiative (CODI) and striving for a comprehensive and integrated system of care for our clients. Dr. Simm is an Associate Professor of Psychiatry with the University of Manitoba Faculty of Medicine, and the Medical Director of the Addictions Unit and staff psychiatrist with the Schizophrenia Program at the Health Sciences Centre. Dr. Simm has presented at the local and national level on Substance-induced psychosis.

DR. A. HERSCOVITCH

Dr. Herscovitch is an Assistant Professor of Psychology with the University of Manitoba Faculty of Medicine and Staff Psychologist at the Addictions Foundation of Manitoba. He is also a Clinical Psychologist in private practice. Dr. Herscovitch has presented at the local, national and international levels on mental health and addiction topics.
